

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE – FOUR YEAR DEGREE PROGRAM

The Bachelor of Science degree programs consist of 126 – 127 hours of coursework offered at the College of Biblical Studies–Houston. Students may transfer up to 69 hours of approved college courses into the program. To earn the Bachelor of Science degree, all students must complete all 30 – 33 hours of their major in residence.

Qualifying students enter the Bachelor of Science four year degree program at any academic level, i.e., freshman: 0-32 hours, sophomore: 33-64 hours, junior: 65+ hours. All students entering the program must meet with an academic advisor to establish guidelines for a degree plan. All graduates earn the Bachelor of Science degree with majors in Biblical Studies or Organizational Leadership.

9. Demonstrate an ability to communicate effectively in spoken and written English.
